





December, we continued to see the price of new domestic vehicles grow as we entered 2020, with the average price registering at \$50,980. This contrasts with European vehicles price points that have been relatively flat month-over-month. Regionally, we've seen BC and Quebec as stand out

In the used vehicle market, the current median price is \$18,990 with relatively little change in the back half of 2019. Since July 2019, the median price of used sedans and trucks have been very

stable. Manitoba and Saskatchewan continued to see the highest average used vehicle price in Canada, a trend that's been consistent since the beginning of last year. Finally, average used

provinces, experiencing consistent growth since the fall.
